For instance, people going on a holiday could be informed about weather conditions. Car drivers can be given an alternative route when there is a traffic jam. A tiny translating machine will enable people who do not share a common language to talk to each other without difficulty or to read foreign publication. Computers will also be used in ordinary public hospitals. A doctor will be able to diagnose the nature of his patients' illness. Similarly, machines could be used to keep a check on a patient's health record and bring it up to date. Book-keepers 2 and Accountants too, could be relieved of dull clerical work. Computers are the most efficient servant that man has ever had.
